CRISIS INTERVENTION TEAM TRAINING FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT

Who should take the training?

This basic, 40-hour training program is designed to equip all law enforcement officers with the tools needed to safely, and effectively, respond to people experiencing a crisis related to behavioral health (including mental health conditions and substance use disorders) and intellectual and developmental disabilities.
