From Collaboration to Change: Strengthening Rural Coordinated Community Responses

Creating meaningful systems change requires more than bringing partners to the table. This full-day training equips multidisciplinary teams with the tools needed to build, assess, and strengthen Coordinated Community Responses (CCRs) in rural communities. Participants will examine the history and purpose of CCRs, identify common misconceptions, and explore strategies for evaluating their local response through survivor-centered approaches such as focus groups, case mapping, and case review. Attendees will also strengthen their understanding of team member roles, shared accountability, mission and vision development, and the practices that support effective collaboration and long-term community impact.

- Develop or refine a CCR mission statement and vision statement that reflects shared community goals.
- Identify next steps for building or strengthening a sustainable CCR within their community.
